Heroes News

This month in Heroes our role-play area is based on a jungle. We will be exploring where animals live. The Heroes will be making jungle hats using paper plates. They will be using one handed tools such as scissors to cut up the tissue paper and use glue to decorate them with animal prints. We will be engaging in sensory play with green play-dough and will be using rollers, cutters and animals to explore different sized footprints. The children will be exploring shapes in the soil and use the animals to find them. This year for Mother's Day children will be painting flower pots and planting seeds and learning how to look after a living thing. The children will be using Easter tissue paper to make their Easter hats and using materials to decorate their Easter baskets. We will be joining in for egg and spoon races for Sports Relief and will use bean bags to balance. We are learning new Makaton signs and our Startwell characters.

Rolos and Sweeties News

This month Rolos/Sweeties are going to be celebrating World Book Day by dressing up as our favourite characters and showing our friends our favourite books. We are going to be designing our own books by making marks and writing familiar letters that we have been learning. In addition, we are going to make our own book marks to take home using creative materials. It is Mother's Day this month and the children will be making Mother's Day cards and flowers to take home using cupcake cases, paint, tissue paper and straws. We are also going to learn about St Patrick's day and how it is celebrated, we are going to make our own hats using card, bowls and green tissue paper. In addition, we will also learn an Irish dance routine and make leaf biscuits. This month for Sports Relief we are going to be carrying out fun activities like egg and spoon race, obstacle courses and bean bag races.

Smarties and Jelly Tots News

The Smarties/Jelly Tots are going to have a busy month in March; the children will be learning to potty train, learning shapes and developing their self-help skills. The children will be learning about grouping objects in relation to category such as size or colour and will compare objects that are the same/different. The children will also be engaging in a variety of creative activities for Mother's Day and discussing why we love our Mums. The Smarties/Jelly Tots will be celebrating St David's day and will be invited to come to Nursery in something yellow and something green for St Patrick's Day which will help them recognise and learn colours. It is also World Book Day so the children can dress up as their favourite character. The Smarties will use the outdoors to take part in an Easter egg hunt and will be learning positional language to find the eggs.

Jelly Babies

This month in babies we are going to be joining in with a range of different messy play activities. We are going to be using coloured paints, children will be encouraged to identify the colours they are using, use a range of tools to create marks such as paint brushes, shaped sponges, fingers, hands, sticks, flowers and cars. The babies will also be joining in with our book of the month 'Monkey Puzzle', we are going to use role-play resources to re-create the story and staff will be encouraging children to use single words such 'mum' and 'book'. On World Book Day we will be using the tents to create a cosy reading corner to listen to different books and sit alongside our friends. We will also be making Mother's Day cards as well as flower printing and making cakes.

Notice for Parents

- Please can parents make sure that you label all of the child's belongings such as their coat, shoes, food supplies etc.
- Pre School parents can you please ensure your child is wearing suitable footwear for the weather, such as shoes with good soles as the wet weather makes the outdoor areas slippery.
- Can we please remind all parents to bring in their child's water bottle each day filled with fresh drinking water. These will be refilled throughout the day and sent home at the end of each day to be cleaned.
- Please make sure that you ring the Nursery if your child is not attending so we know where they are.
- Please make sure that your child brings in a Nursery bag with them each day as they may have letters, or creations they have made to go inside. It is also essential that they have a pair of spare clothes as children can have accidents, get messy or wet!
- Please can all parents adhere to 2m social distancing and wear a face mask while on the Nursery site.
